message from the editor..

If you were to hear the phrase 'Education for Sustainable Development', what would immediately spring to mind? Replacing your school's light bulbs with energy-efficient alternatives? Your school's waste recycling programme? Or do you just feel an overwhelming sense of fatigue at the thought of another government initiative, with targets to meet and forms to complete?

With the recently-stated DCSF target of every school being sustainable by 2020, this is indeed another performance measurement for schools, and if you've been involved in your school's SEF for your next Ofsted, you'll be aware that this requires you to report on your current sustainability agenda. However, according to recent research carried out by Schoolzone amongst SLT members and teachers from a range of schools, there is simultaneously a lack of awareness of the range of environmental and sustainability programmes that schools can choose to become involved in, and widespread confusion about 'what counts' as working towards being a 'sustainable school'.

The DCSF's self evaluation tool for sustainability, S3 (available to download at http://www.teachernet.gov.uk/sustainable-schools/upload/s3_self_evaluation_tool.pdf) sets out eight 'doorways' against which you should evaluate your school's sustainability agenda. Many of these link very closely with the 'Every Child Matters' agenda - such as healthy eating, being safe, and making a positive contribution to your school and local environment. In fact, when questioned more closely, many teachers found that sustainability was at the heart of much of school life - such as primary schools creating a vegetable garden to supply their school kitchen with fresh vegetables for their healthy eating campaign, or secondary schools employing Sixth Form students to clean the school buildings.

The other important message that environmental organisations are keen to emphasise is that in schools where sustainability has become embedded in school life, the real drivers behind this are the students themselves - albeit with the firm backing of the SLT. With 'pupil voice' another key government initiative, this is a way to engage students in taking responsibility for their school's sustainability agenda, contributing to the future of their planet, and - let's face it - relieving teachers of the day-to-day burden of another government initiative.

Schoolzone is currently working with various organisations to explore how aware schools are of the government's target. This month, we're going to be running a teacher and pupil survey into awareness of sustainability, areas of current engagement, and the barriers to becoming involved. The link to this will be in the January Newswire, and on the Schoolzone website from the middle of this month, so please do keep a watch out for this.

And, on a slightly different note, thanks to those teachers who took part in Schoolzone's annual review of its own services and website. It was good to hear that we still seem to be on the right track with regards to the look and feel of the site, and the services we're providing. Work is ongoing on this, so again do keep on visiting the site and volunteering to take part in our research. We've a number of really interesting consultancy opportunities at the moment which require reviewing voluntary-sector and charities' materials. This is not only the chance for you to earn a bit of extra cash at a rather expensive time of year, but, according to one Headteacher attendee at the 'sustainable development' focus group, this was the 'best bit of CPD I've done all year'.
